Bacon and Tomato Dip

Servings: Makes 16 servings Serving Size: 2 tablespoons

Ingredients:

- 1 cup fat free sour cream
- 1 cup low fat mayonnaise
- 2 large tomatoes, diced, reserve excess juice
- 4 slices bacon, cooked crisp and crumbled
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder

Directions:

- 1. Combine all ingredients.
- 2. Add reserved tomato juice until dip reaches desired consistency.
